Once you have completed the New Employee paperwork and set up your LCU Authentication Method through Office.com, you will need to set up a Moodle account. Lubbock Christian University uses Moodle as our Learning Management System, this will be where you find your Title IX training course.

<u>Use your LCU login credentials</u> to <u>set up your email authentication</u>, upon completion, you will need to create your account in Moodle.

In order for your account in Moodle to be created, you will login to moodle.lcu.edu and follow the onscreen instructions to authenticate your Moodle account. You will be able to access Moodle but may not see Title IX training – Faculty and Staff yet. Once you complete that process, contact instructional technology or Kecia Jackson who will be able to assign you to your Title IX training course. As an instructor, you have access to Moodle for all of the courses you will be instructing.
