






















WARNING: When creating pins, Yellowdig intends that instructor pins be added each week, rather than all at once.

If you would like pin content to be created all at once, there are a couple of options:

- 1. Create pin <u>content in a word document</u> and then copy and paste pin content into Yellowdig each week. Content will be saved in Word and not have to then be recreated.
- 2. Create multiple pins in Yellowdig, but clearly Title "Week 1 Discussion, Week 2 Discussion...etc."
 - a. Make topics to match for easier use in locating pins (Users may click on topics to locate related pins)
 - b. Keep in Mind Pins will show in feed in order added, so if Pins are added chronologically: week 1, week 2, week 3, they will show in feed: week 3, week 2, week 1 (most recent entry on top of feed)

Make it very clear in your original pin or course description how Yellowdig forum posts are to look: professional or casual, the type of language to be used: text speak or APA, and requirements expected: links, references, word count, images...

Board owner may delete any pins or comments that do not fit criteria.

Board owner comments may also redirect criteria not suited for requirements

Instructor feedback in pins and comments keep discussion engaged and on target


Grading Options


Grades will automatically be passed back to Moodle based on the Point settings in Yellowdig. *Points shown in next screen shot*


The preconfigured points do not grade content. A separate grade item may be created if choosing to take a grade from the content pinned in Yellowdig.


Yellowdig forum discussions may be included as participation, content development, ongoing assessment of knowledge, or as a redirection tool.


Yellowdig is designed to promote engaging interaction with more options for submitting content than in a typical forum.


